## Welcome from the Director of Music

The Wilson's School Music Department is delighted that you are able to join us this evening to celebrate and enjoy the outstanding musicianship of our students. Tonight's concert is jampacked with ensembles, both familiar and new. Indeed, two ensembles will be making their concert debut at Wilson's this evening. Our Percussion Ensemble, directed by Mr French, will open the second half of our programme. Listen out for their rousing drum rolls—they will be summoning you back from the interval! The student-led Carnatic Society grew out of a GCSE Music Ensemble Performance from last year's cohort, and tonight, the senior members of the group will be performing a piece by Muthuswami Dikshitar (1775-1835), one of the Trinity of Carnatic Music. Many of our well-established ensembles including the Barbershop, both Middle School and Senior Wind Bands, and Wilson's School Symphony Orchestra will perform famous melodies from the movies tonight, alongside some original arrangements by Mr Kramer for the Odyssey Big Band and by the players in Skiaull, our recently formed folk group. Throughout the evening, ensembles will be performing a range of classical music, including two pieces by English composers--William Walton's ever-popular march Crown Imperial, performed by Chamber Wind, will open the concert, and Senior Strings will play the last movement of Benjamin Britten's Simple Symphony, which is dedicated to the composer's childhood viola teacher. Amongst all this, you'll find a few festive favourites as well. You're in for a treat!
